# **Acrylic material list**

### **Paint**

Golden heavy body acrylics, this set should be sufficient. We are looking for Red, Blue, Yellow, and white. We'll mix our colors from that, black won't be used much.

#### **Brushes**

Rosemary & Co is the brush company I recommend all my students to. They're brushes are the best quality but this mom and daughter company keeps prices low. <u>Here</u> are <u>a couple</u> different sets to consider.

What we're looking for is one or two flats (anywhere from  $\frac{1}{4}$ " to  $\frac{3}{4}$ "), a couple rounds, and a blending brush.

### **Easel**

<u>Tabletop easel</u> or <u>standing easel</u> I'd recommend the standing easel type if you can get one, the are much more adjustable and can be used as a tabletop easel.

#### Canvas

Canvas panels are handy, they don't take up much space and generally considered better than stretched canvas. We are using 8" x 10" or 11" x 14" in this class. Please bring a couple blanks per class.

## Sketch paper and pencil

Good to have for taking notes, sketching ideas, and for Adam to give demonstrations on as he comes around.

#### **Canvas carrier**

Handy to have, keeps wet paint from getting on things like car seats, but not strictly necessary. <u>Here</u> are some that I recommend.

#### **Palette**

A glass palette is the easiest to clean and use, but wooden ones work well as well. Stay away from plastic if possible.

## Palette knife

Important to have, necessary for mixing colors. The <u>Teardrop</u> M shape is what we're after.

### **Water containers**

Please bring two containers for water. The center only has drinking mugs and would not appreciate acrylic paint on them.

# Paper towels

Needed for cleaning brushes, Viva is a great brand for this.

## **Spray bottle or Mister**

Handy to have to keep the paint fresh.
