Advisory Notification

Belmont Emergency Management would like to make you aware of the following advisory from the National Weather Service

- **Snow begins late this evening, quickly becoming steadier and heavier overnight into Monday morning**
- **24-hour event, beginning Sunday evening and continuing through Monday**
- **Strongest portion of the storm pre-dawn Monday into early Monday afternoon**
- **Blizzard conditions develop before dawn Monday**
- **Periods of heavy snow during the morning into early afternoon with rates of 2 – 4 inches per hour**
- **Northeast wind gusts of 45 to 55 MPH will cause whiteout conditions**
- **16 to 22 inches of snow possible**
- **Potential for power outages**

Governor Healey has declared a State of Emergency this afternoon, advising drivers to stay off the roadways beginning tonight.

SNOWSTORM SAFETY TIPS

- Be informed by receiving alerts, warnings, and public safety information before, during, and after emergencies, and follow instructions from public safety officials.
- Prepare for power outages. Keep electronic devices charged.
- Use caution and take frequent breaks when shoveling snow to prevent overexertion.
- Clear exhaust vents.
- Check on neighbors.
